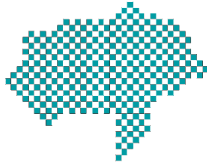




People are safer due to fewer vulnerable and repeat victims of crime

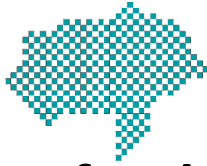


- For the 12 months to March 2015: North Yorkshire Police had lowest crimes per 1,000 population in England and 2nd lowest in England and Wales.



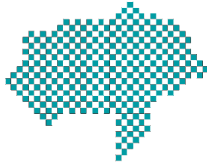
People are safer due to fewer vulnerable and repeat victims of crime

- Increased the number of successful prosecutions for: Sexual and domestic, Hate crime, and Other vulnerable victims
 - Introduced temporary resource to undertake case quality review function for rape and serious sexual offences:
 - acts as central oversight function for cases submitted by officers for progression to Crown Prosecution Service
 - helps ensure getting it right first time for victims
- Supporting Crown Prosecution Services (CPS) and other agencies to deliver victim centred justice as swiftly as possible
 - Victim Journey – review to update and explore multi-agency efficiencies:
 - A task and finish group set up under Victim & Witness Board of Local Criminal Justice Board (LCJB), 1st meeting 11th August
 - terms of reference developed, to be agreed next Victims and Witness Board
 - Sessions planned to review key journey stages with appropriate partners
 - Draft multi-agency service level agreement around complaints
 - Was discussed at LCJB on 18th August with Crown Prosecution Service and Courts to suggest amendments



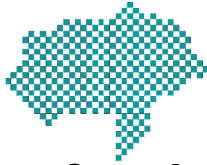
People are safer due to fewer vulnerable and repeat victims of crime

- Developed and implemented measures to assess the extent to which repeat victimisation is tackled through the IDVA and ISVA contract specifically in relation to Domestic Abuse, Hate Crime, Other vulnerable victims
 - Total 685 referrals
 - of which 459 Independent Domestic Violence Advisors (IDVA) and
 - 226 Independent Sexual Violence Advisors (ISVA).
- Piloting approach to track repeat crime comparing domestic abuse victims being supported by Independent Domestic Violence Advisors (IDVA) and hate crime and other vulnerable victims being supported by Independent Victim Advisers (IVA) against victims not taking up IDVA or IVA offer
 - 2nd stage pilot planned to compare historic victimisation against reported crime after support commences
 - Corporate Performance to run first set of data end of September 2015.



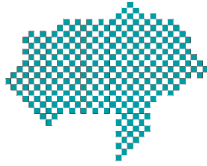
People are safer due to fewer vulnerable and repeat victims of crime

- Developed and implemented a Children and Young People Strategy
 - Safer Schools Partnership
 - PCSO selected for York High School – starts 16th September
 - PCSO selected for Graham School – starts 8th September
 - Harrogate School seeking Governor views to decide whether or not to take part
 - Safeguarding training delivered to 11 PCSOs via a pilot
 - Crucial Crew
 - Recent events held Scarborough and Harrogate - multi-agency Coordinating Group to be established
 - Volunteer Police Cadets to be piloted September 2015
 - 10 leaders selected, 40 places allocated, 9 on reserve list, run at Askham Bryan College, opening night for new unit 23rd September, Passing Out Parade 10th December
 - Safer Neighbourhood Teams work with schools to prevent and tackle antisocial behaviour



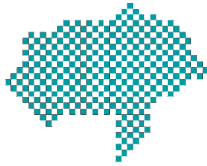
People are safer due to fewer vulnerable and repeat victims of crime

- Leaders Unlocked, supported via the Commissioner's Community Fund, recruited 30 (43 applicants) North Yorkshire Youth Commissioner's to support review and development of revised Children and Young People Strategy 2016/17
- Youth Commission launch event held on Saturday 11 July 2015
- Youth Commissioners assigned to priorities will engage up to 1,500 young people to gain the views and recommendations on how North Yorkshire Police can best work young people:
 - Youth Commissioner skills training complete
 - 30+ events planned throughout autumn, week commencing 7 September at Selby College
 - Documents updated on website so public can view details and progress
 - Blog and Youth Commissioner profiles to be considered for website inclusion
 - Independent workshop held to support North Yorkshire Police review of Integrated Neighbourhood Management.



People are safer due to fewer vulnerable and repeat victims of crime

- Developed and agreed a force-wide coordinated approach to measure victim satisfaction and confidence across the victim journey
 - A research organisation (Buzzz) was awarded a contract to review six specialist commissioned support services through direct victim and stakeholder contact.
 - Groups of victims to assess has been agreed, stakeholder interviews and victim interviews/focus groups scheduled for September
 - Action plan to be developed to implement remaining key recommendations arising from the Victim Needs Analysis, plan to repeat process in 2016/17.

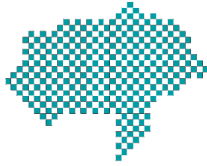

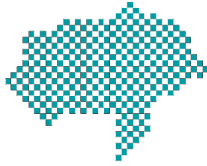
IOM Cohort Reduction in Reoffending (offences) against Cohort Baseline

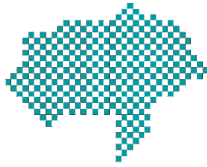
People are safer due to fewer individuals committing crime and/or antisocial behaviour

- Demonstrated reduction in re-offending through enhanced working with partners and other sectors
 - Integrated Offender Management (IOM) scheme. Developing stronger links between IOM and Safer Neighbourhood teams to improve services
 - Troubled Families programme is progressing. Strengthening links with local authorities through the secondment of a coordinator
- Demonstrated effective impact upon driver behaviour
 - Revised **Speed Management Protocol** agreed
 - Motorcycle First Aid**
 - Junior Road Safety Officer Programme**
 - Walk Wise**
 - Pedestrian Training**
 - Bus Back & Roadside Poster Campaign**

- Effective disruption and dismantling of organised criminality
 - Effective contribution to the Strategic Policing Requirement

- Strategic alliance and collaborative plans agreed

- Demonstrated value for money for collaborative services
 - Project team has been established to support collaborative services based on costs being distributed equally across each of the Forces involved
 - All projects and business cases demonstrate value for money in both the outline and full agreements
