City Task Force: A dedicated team who will understanding the specific needs of the City of York and provide the appropriate support and action to reducing crime and the fear of crime.

Mental Health Coordinators: will provide support to our most vulnerable to reduce demand on our emergency services.

Visible community policing: will provide targeted support and action to meet the community's needs, reducing crime, the fear of crime and enabling people to be safe and feel safe.

Public safety officer: will work closely with communities and our public sector partners to improve communication and productivity

Community Resilience Teams: will provide a visible presence and will be dedicated to working with our partners to reduce crime.

The Commissioner inherited a Financial Plan from the former Fire Authority that had an underlying £1.2m annual imbalance, and organisational plans that would have seen this imbalance increase to at least £2.5m across the life of that 4 year plan.

While much work has been done to stabilise the financial position of the organisation the Precept increase for 2019/20 unfortunately does little to address the underlying budget imbalance that the Commissioner has inherited.

Options will be developed over the coming two years to return the Fire service to a recurring balanced financial position.

The Neighbourhood Policing survey I carried out last year also identified that people want more visible policing.

That is why I have worked closely with the Chief Constable of North Yorkshire Police to ensure that the money raised will be ring-fenced to increase the number of police officers by at least 50. In addition, local policing will be further boosted by approximately 20 more PCSOs.

The Chief Fire Officer will work with the me to support the serious financial challenges with the fire service and focus on protecting the frontline.







Police budget breakdown


