NYP Children and Young Person Strategy (C&YP): The organisation Leaders Unlocked, supported via the Commissioner’s Community Fund, have recruited 30 North Yorkshire Youth Commissioner’s to support the review & development of a revised NYP C&YP Strategy for 2016/17. The launch event on the 11th July enabled the team to identify four initial priorities to be the focus of activity over the next 5 months, these priorities were discussed and refined at the second event on the 7th of August: Legal Highs & Substance Misuse; Cyber Bullying & Internet Safety; Hate Crime; and Homelessness, Exploitation & Vulnerability. A further two priorities are to be confirmed week commencing 10th August after which teams of Youth Commissioners assigned to each priority will look to engage with up to 1,500 young people within North Yorkshire to gain their views and recommendations on how North Yorkshire Police can best work with them on these subjects. Approximately 40 events will be identified for Youth Commissioner attendance over the next few months.</p> | |
