4.	 Thematic – Organised Crime D/Supt Steve Thomas Head of Organised Crime gave a presentation on the activity and challenges of organised crime locally, regionally and nationally. The HMIC inspection in 2016 highlighted 4 areas within the Serious Crime Area that required improvement. The presentation defined Organised Crime and also the work being done locally and nationally to combat it as well as showing the actions taken following the inspection. Detailed consideration was given to the presentation focusing on National, Regional and Local Organised Crime. There was a consideration of the MORILE (Management of Risk In Law Enforcement) methodology and the tool used by all policing bodies to assess Organised Crime was explained to show how crimes were established and the threat, risk and harm identified and addressed. The presentation gave a picture of the reporting and recording of crimes within North Yorkshire and how clear understanding and technical advances all impact upon why the crimes have been identified as a priority. The Serious Crime Board has been implemented and has received positive feedback from the Home Office. The meeting has a range of organisations involved and the forum has raised the profile of the Serious Crime Unit. There are now robust processes in place within North Yorkshire with links to the Home Office and the College of Policing. 	For Information
