Why will there only be police involvement in speed enforcement if there's a fatality or someone seriously hurt?</p> <p>We are effectively doing the polices job for them'</p> <p>There are a range of measures to enhance road safety, and we do also engage with our local communities. Community speed watch is one of those range of methods that has proved to be successful that we use as an education method rather than an enforcement. Community speed watch is normally deployed where there is a perception of speeding but no evidence to show that speeding is an issue. There is a complex matrix in place that looks at several different sources for evidence based deployment.</p>	For Information
4.	<p><u>Thematic – Rural Crime</u></p> <p>ACC Amanda Oliver and Inspector Jon Grainge (Rural Taskforce) led a discussion on Rural Crime.</p> <p>The discussion looked at the journey North Yorkshire Police have been on following the National Rural Crime Network Survey in 2016 that highlighted that rural communities were experience greater fear of crime than expected. Following the results of this survey North Yorkshire Police decided to dedicate resource to rural crime and the Rural Taskforce was established.
