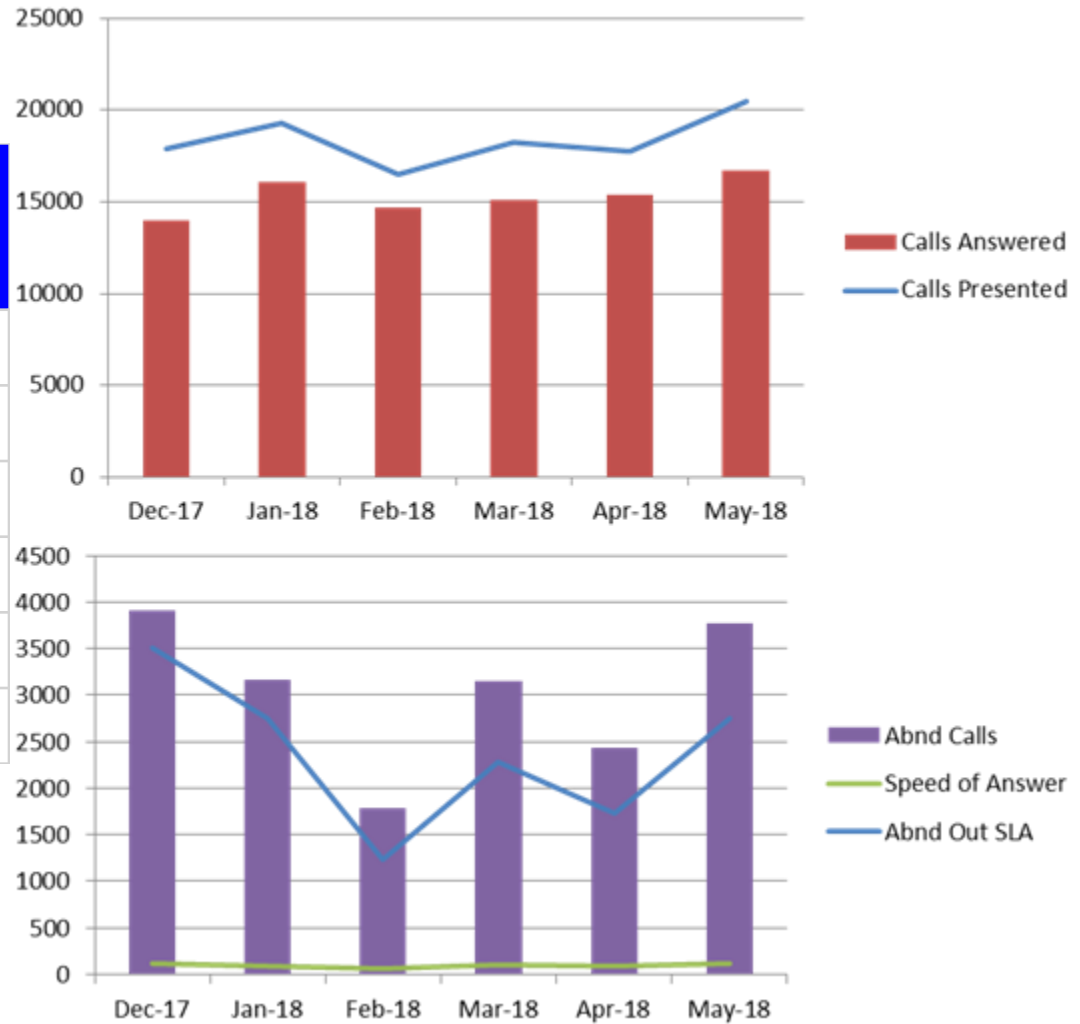

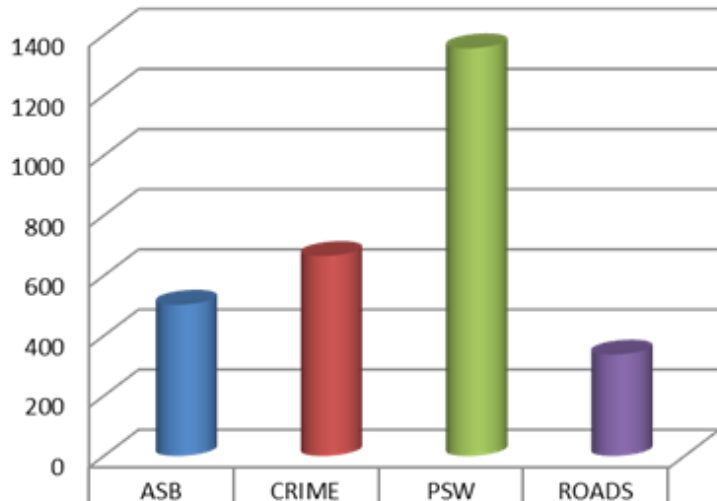

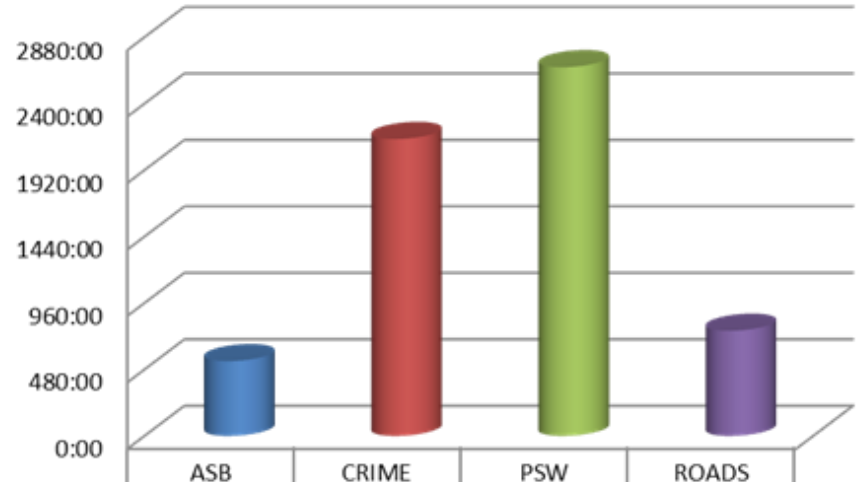
City Response (Calls for Service when an officer is dispatched – York and Selby)

Total Calls For Service



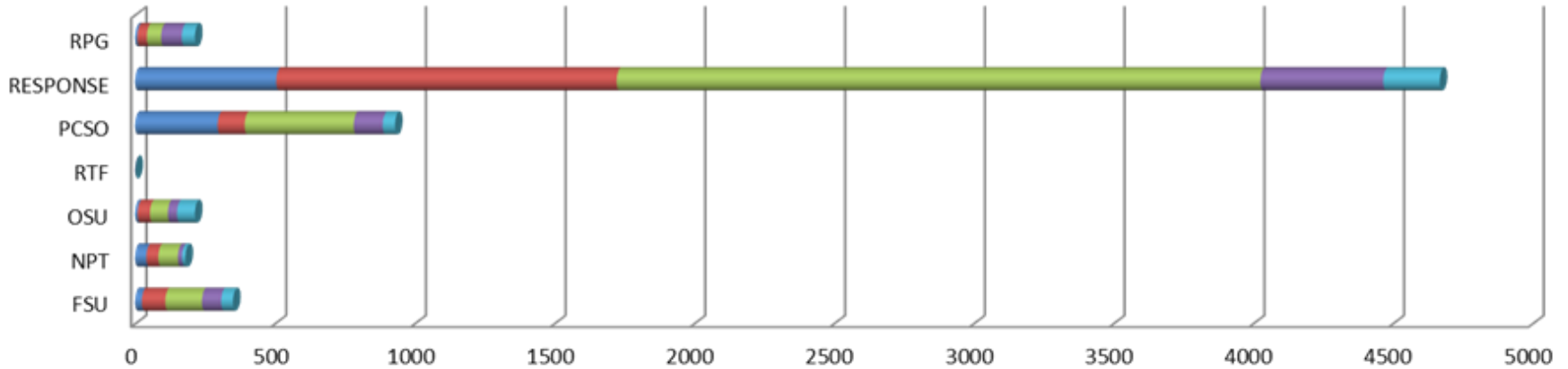

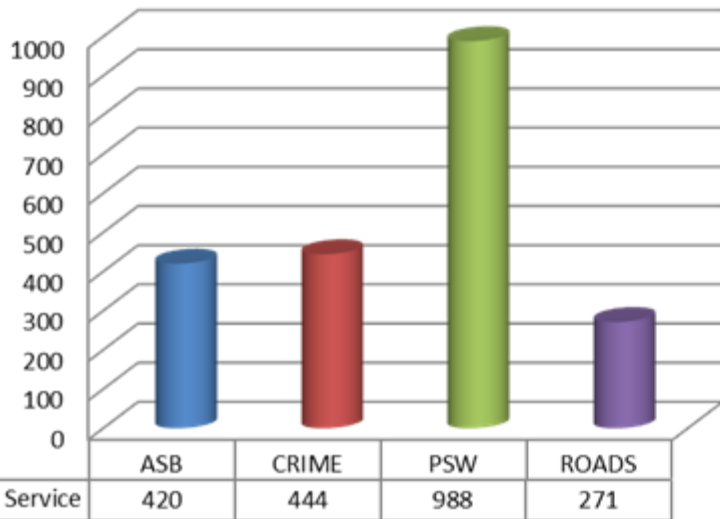

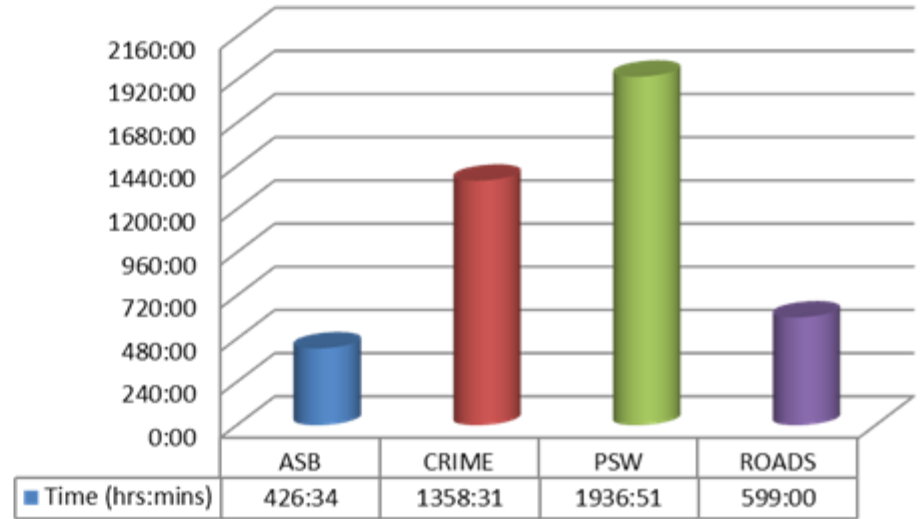

Coast Response (Calls for Service when an officer is dispatched – S'boro and Ryedale)

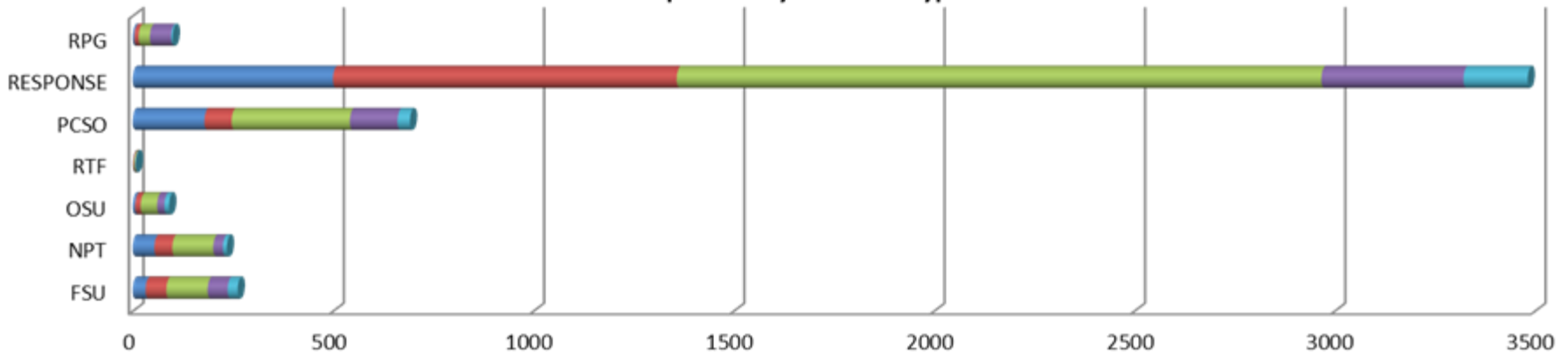
Total Calls For Service



Total Time (hrs:mins)



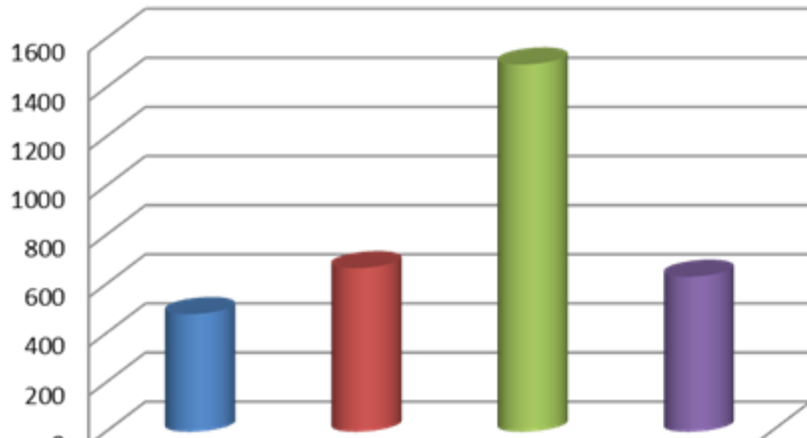

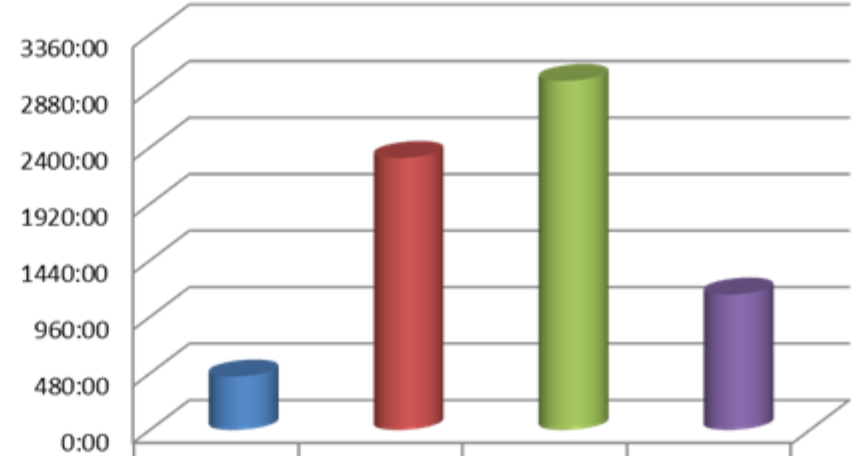
County Response (Calls for Service when an officer is dispatched – Hamb, Rich, H'gate and Craven)

Total Calls For Service



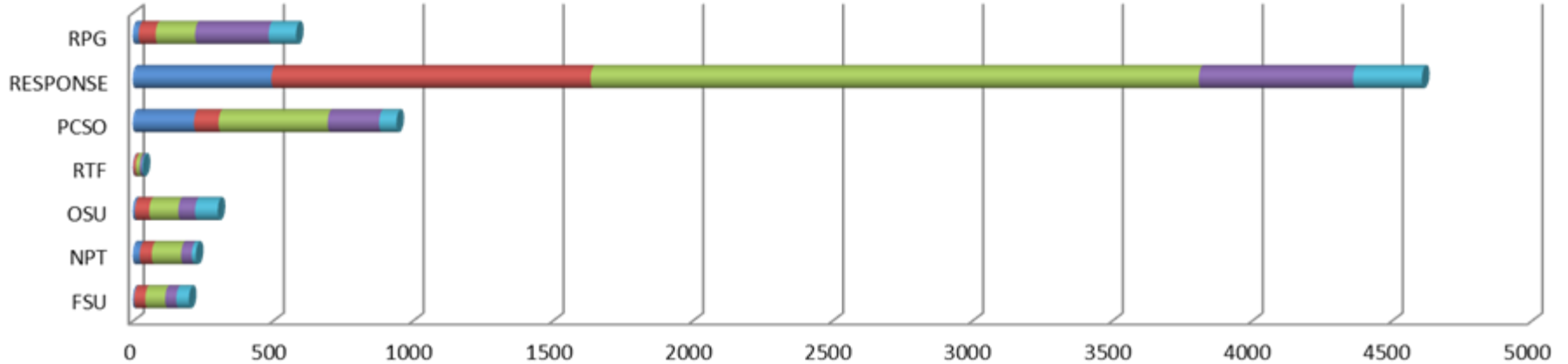

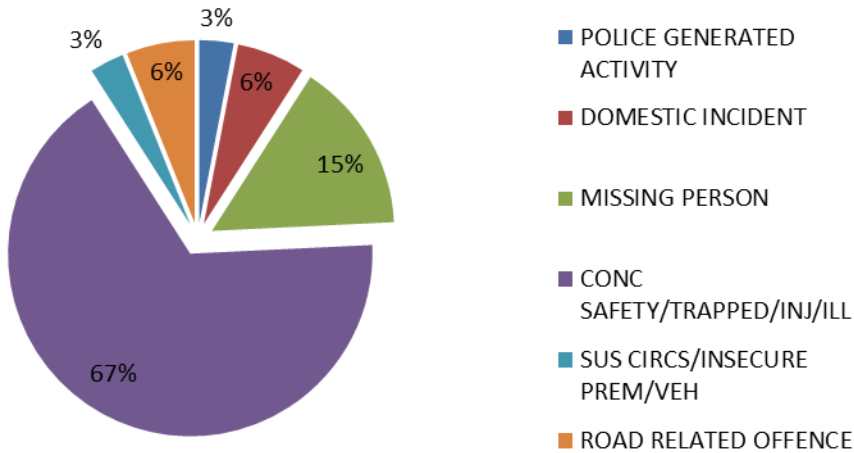

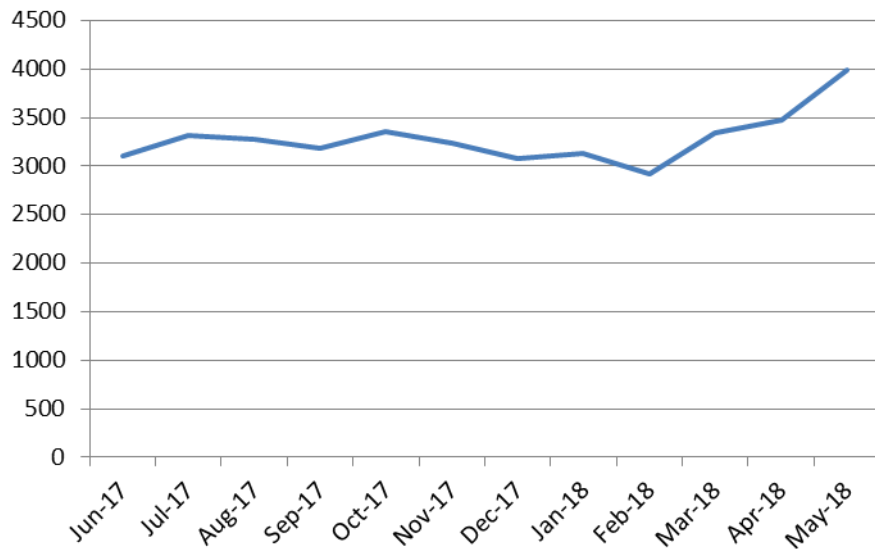

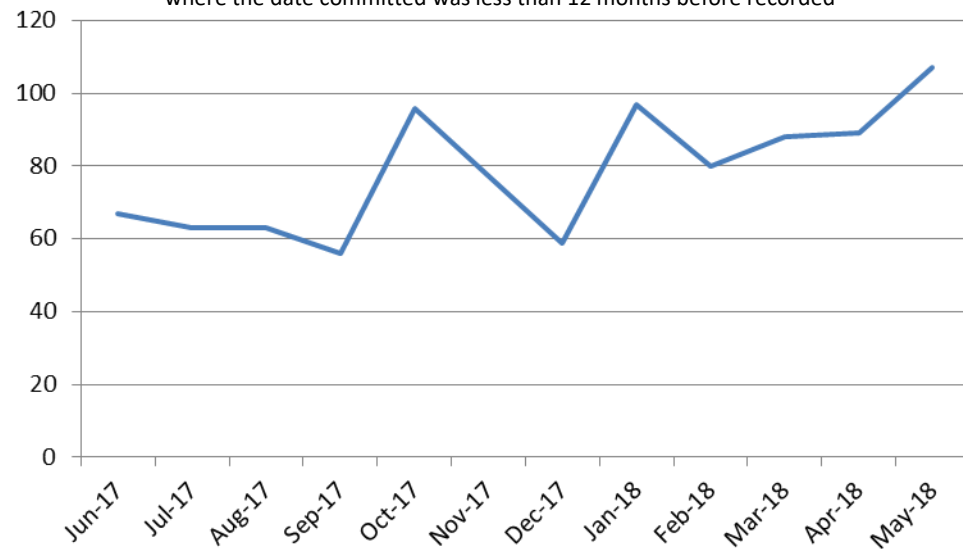

Volume of Recent Recorded Crimes last 12 months



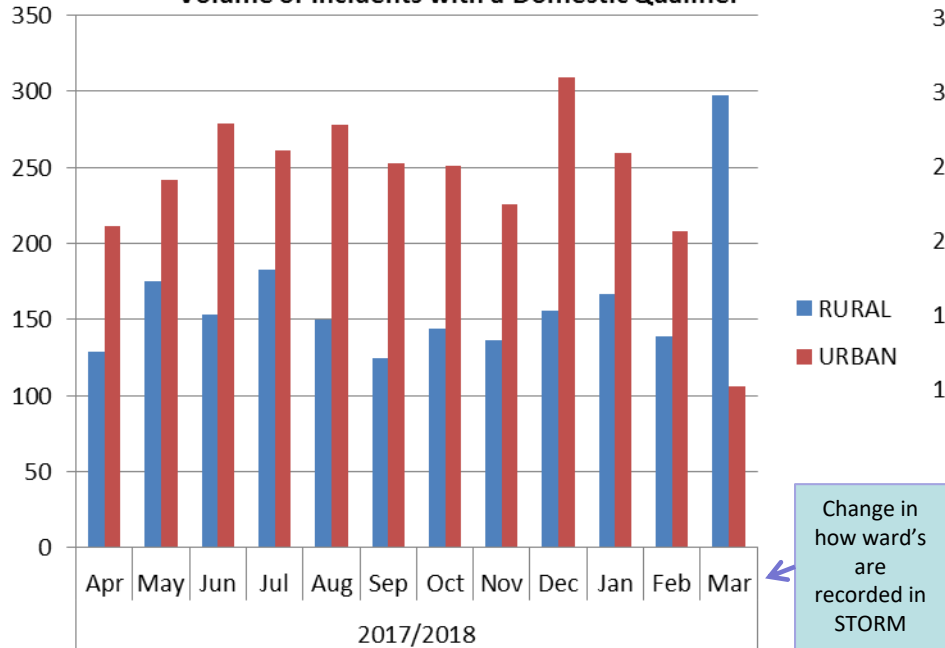
Volume of Historic Recorded Crimes last 12 months

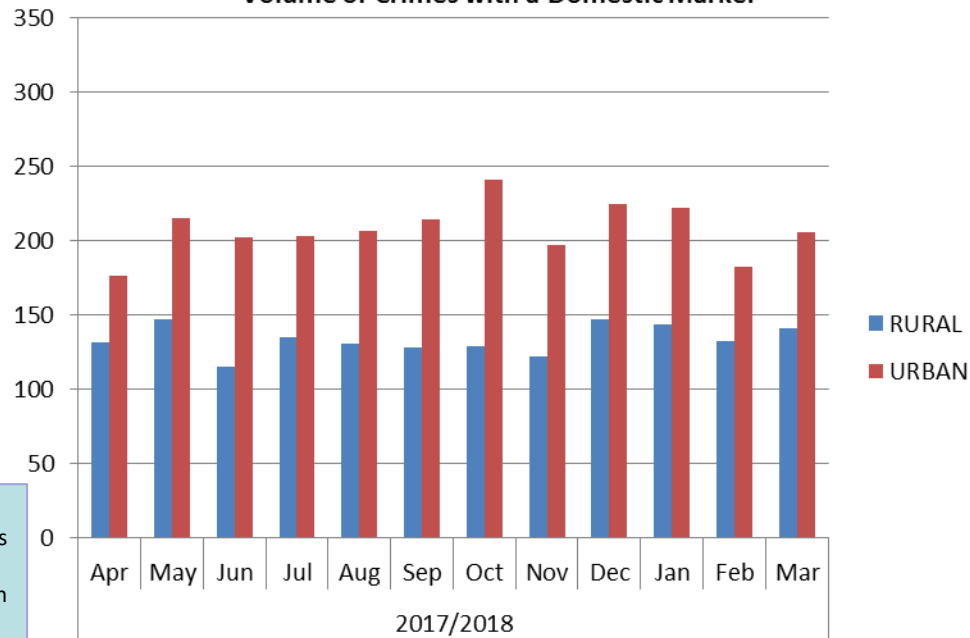

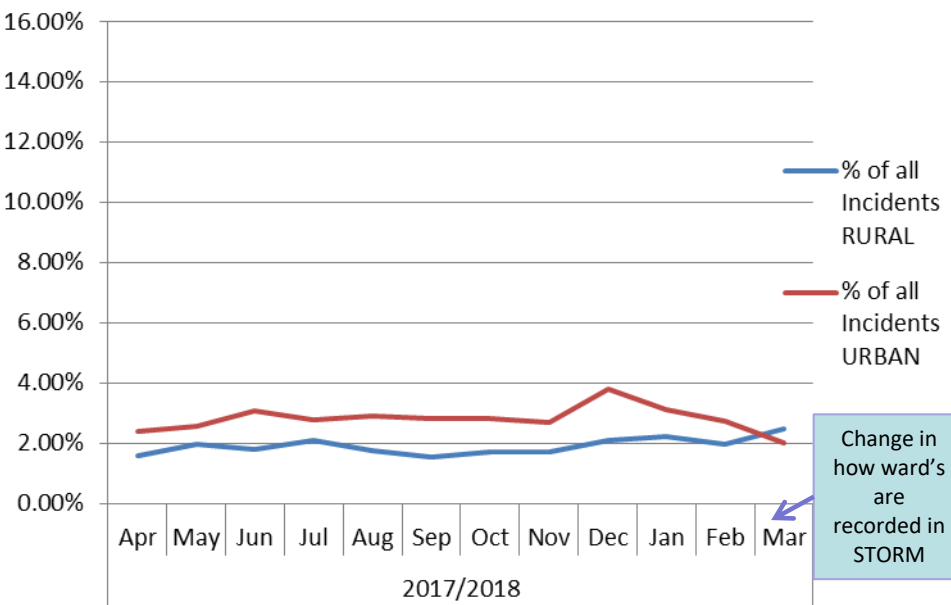
Volume of Incidents with a Domestic Qualifier



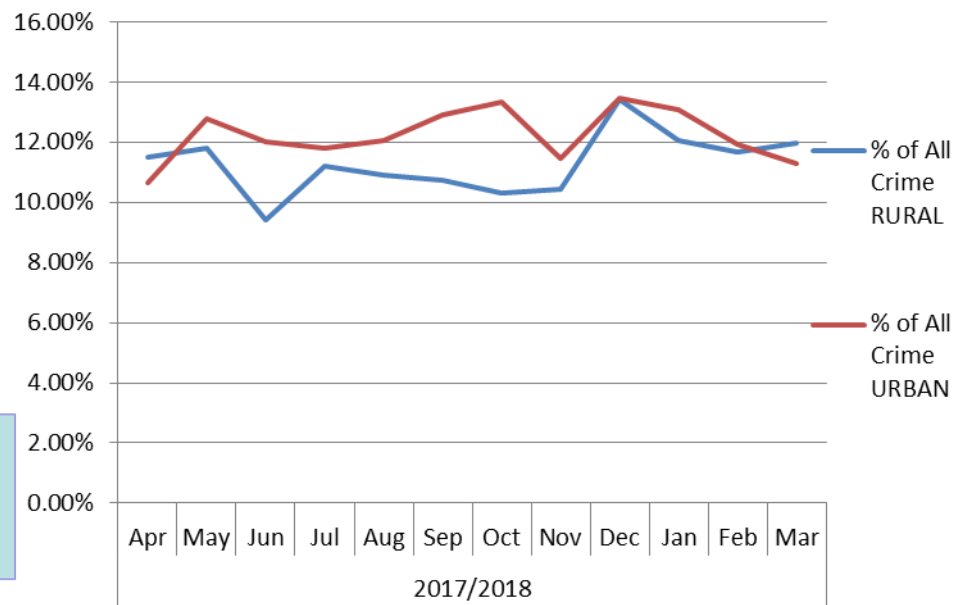
Volume of Crimes with a Domestic Marker

Rural Crime Task Force (RTF)

- **People**

Current volunteer recruitment undergoing for mobile rural watch at Helmsley, which will be established imminently. Further volunteer recruitment ongoing for watch schemes in Craven, York. Sue Proudfoot, Volunteer Coordinator for Girsby Watch shortlisted for the BAWP Volunteer of the Year award, the ceremony for which is next week. Awaiting PC in Scarborough area to be released, upcoming PC vacancy in York, otherwise team at full strength.

- **Proactivity**

Rural – Op Sidekick continues with targeted response to quad, plant, and machinery theft from farms. Op Woollen stands at around 6500 / 8500 farms offered crime prevention advice. Op Woodchip now being established to look at proactive crime prevention to rural businesses. Op Fuego supported with prevention in Selby district. Op Harvester – mobile rural watches - has seen 24 watch night since the start of the year contributing 720 volunteer hours. Wildlife – Op Owl – preventing raptor persecution – planned in through rest of year in conjunction with National Parks and local gamekeepers.

- **Productivity**

Recent arrests of travelling criminals for acquisitive crime from the Durham, Cleveland, and West Yorkshire areas. Numerous ongoing investigations ongoing into wildlife crime (badger persecution, raptor persecution, poaching, animal welfare issues), and rural crime, particularly around quad thefts, and equine crime. Internal training event planned to train officers on wildlife crime. Training planned for new and existing FCR staff through June- August.

- **Problem Solving**

Problem Solving Plans are now in place for poaching (Op Galileo), raptor persecution (Op Owl), equine crime (Op Exceed), fly-tipping (Op Eyeball) and plant and machinery theft (Op Sidekick). Op Byway, Galileo, Woollen and Sidekick all address problems identified on area. Op Eyeball is working in conjunction with all local councils, and will formulate information sharing and days of action, as well as prevention / communication strategies. RTF have made contributions to the crime prevention strategies of both North Yorkshire's National Parks.

- **Public Service**

Over twenty Calendar events planned through summer season for engagement with Bobby the tractor, which include summer shows, and five schools from which pupils won a competition to have a visit. This month includes Richmond schools, and events in York, Ripon, Bedale and Huby. The Yorkshire Post have run a recent week of articles focussing on rural crime, wildlife crime and NYP's use of volunteers. RTF continue to have social media presence on Facebook and Twitter, to continue liaising with public, and identify issues, including the support of the recent NRCN survey.
