

Youth Offending Services Overview North Yorkshire Youth Justice Service (YJS)



- Youth Outcomes Panel (YOP) YJS, YOT & NYP
 - Specialist YJS resources to develop & facilitate
 - Assess young people & provide appropriate interventions to divert away from youth justice system
 - Meet the needs of victims
- Restorative Practice approach, including Restorative Justice & Victim Engagement
- First Time Entrants (FTEs) = 2,195/100k (April 17–March 18)
 - 60% reduction in 24 months ending 31/12/18
- Re-offending* (3-month reporting) = 46.1%, rate of 7.22 per re-offender (July-Sep 16)



Youth Offending Services Overview York Youth Offending Team (YOT)



- Identify, track, monitor & develop more focused, timely, multi-agency interventions for Reoffending Cohort, including YOP referees
- Implement YJB re-offending 'live tracker' toolkit, to inform strategy & case management processes
- Implement monthly multi-agency re-offending panels, support joined up approach to reducing re-offending through focussed interventions
- FTE = 393/100k (12-month rolling reporting period, improvement on previous recording period)
- Re-offending (3-month reporting) = 13%, rate of 3.15 per re-offender (1 prolific offender)



Youth Outcomes Panel (YOP)



YJS, YOT & North Yorkshire Police (Inspector Chair)

Purpose:

Ensure young people have correct threshold, proportionality and appropriateness applied to decision-making & where appropriate, children & young people are dealt with outside criminal justice system (CJS)

Aims:

- Support multi-agency approach to prevention of further/re-offending
- Support diversion from criminal justice system & reduce FTE's
- Enable restorative approaches with victims
- Divert young people into services to address causes of offending behaviour
- Ensure appropriate outcomes for disadvantaged young people e.g. LAC

May 17- June 18:

29 panels delivered; 48% intervention outcomes outside CJS



Youth Outcomes Panel (YOP): Process

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Offence* committed & admitted:

- Gravity assessed by OIC for YOP referral suitability (Gravity score 1-3)
- YJS / YOT undertake screening, including multi-agency previous & current involvement check, & Police review Niche information

Fortnightly Senior Panel - Operational Manager, Inspector led:

- Offence summary, PENY 145, Youth Gravity Matrix, MG5 summary,
 victim statement screened & used to inform discussion
- Decision made following discussion

Panel Outcomes:

- Range = No Further Action to Charge & include CRD's, DAR's avoiding CJS
- Appropriate intervention / referral for all actioned outcomes
- 1st Youth Caution multi agency response via Prevention, YJS or CSC
- Second or subsequent Youth Caution = YJS / YOT assessment & support
- Youth Conditional Caution = YJS / YOT assessment & support



Youth Outcomes Panel (YOP): Impact



May 17-June 18:

- 29 YOPs 100% attendance, all agencies
- 315 offence referrals re. 273 young people:
 - 67% = Males, 33% = Females, 23% = Aged 15
 - 22% = Scarborough (Scarborough =13% 10-17 population)
 - 28% = York (York = 22% 10-17 population)
 - LAC = 17% of cases (23% North Yorkshire)
 - 117/315 offences (37%) related to Violent offences
 - 48% outcomes dealt with outside CJS, intervention or support referral
 - 46% = Community Resolution Disposal (CRD)
 - 3% (9 cases) = No Further Action
 - 26% = Youth Conditional Caution
 - Reduction in FTE for North Yorkshire & York
- Victim feedback included in all referrals

North Yorkshire Youth Commission (NYYC)



- Provider: Leaders Unlocked
- Service: Management of Youth Commission, delivery of peer-research projects, embedding of recommendations
- Purpose: Enables young people to support, challenge and inform the work of the Police & Crime Commissioner and North Yorkshire Police around the NYYCs self-selected six priorities:
 - Mental Health & Vulnerable Young People
 - Abusive Relationships
 - Hate Crime
 - Relationship between Young People, Police & Authorities
 - Drug & Alcohol Abuse
 - Missing Young People and Exploitation
- NYYC comprises 30-35 diverse young people, aged 14-25, from across NY

NYYC: 2016-18 Impact



- Recruited, trained & supported 35 young Youth Commission members
- Identified 6 key priorities with young people from across the county
- Engaged views of over 4,000 young people aged 14-25 through 'Big Conversation' peer-research projects
- Shared recommendations via 2 multi-agency conferences
- Produced 7 short films to raise awareness amongst young people
- Continued to actively inform & influence work of NYP, PCC & partners:
 - Led 6 groups with key NYP leads & partners to inform work & practice
 - Influenced changes made to Stop & Search form
 - Involved in 'Connect' project NYP mental health awareness training
 - Involved in development & launch of Misogyny as a Hate Crime
 - Informed development of NYP Children & Young People's Strategy
 - Participated in NYP work experience, Women in Policing, PCSO & Neighbourhood
 Policing Conferences
 - Actively involved in delivery/monitoring of NYP, PCC & partner actions Poly



NYYC: June 18-May 20 Plans

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- Local Coordinator recruitment & management
- Recruitment, management, coordination of Youth Commission members
- Management & development of local embedding work with NYP & partners, in line with 2017-18 Big Conversation & NYP Young People's Strategy
- Participation in NYP sub-groups to inform, assess & direct work of NYP
- Review & inform NYP engagement & communication work with young people
- Lead, develop & participate in associated projects & campaigns, to inform & direct work of NYP, PCC & partners
- Inform, direct & participate in NYP recruitment & training processes/events
- Support, inform & shape development of NYP & PCC community engagement activity, focussing on under-represented groups
- Ensure a coordinated, joined up approach to youth voice & influence work, including participation in associated forums
- Deliver promotional activity to highlight positive work of NYYC



NYP Children & Young Person Strategy 2018 - 2020



- New Strategy launched January 2018
- Developed in collaboration with North Yorkshire Youth Commission (NYYC)
 & contains a foreword from them
- Based on National Strategy, NYYC priorities*, Police & Crime Plan
- Promotes force wide focus on developing, promoting & embedding key areas of work to support Young People
- Helps put Young People's opinions at the centre of development work relating to them
- Delivery Plan priorities informed by NYYC recommendations
- Delivery Plan identifies NYP lead responsible for each area of Strategy
- Regular monitoring & review in place with leads & NYCC
- Joint work between NYP, PCC & NYYC
