



These are the grounds for complaint:

1. The 'information not held' finalisation is challenged on the basis that I am given to understand, from normally reliable sources, that there are at least two such claims.

2. An internal review should, therefore, be conducted by a person independent of, and more senior to, the disclosure officer finalising the instant request.

3. The review should disclose the type of searches undertaken and the business areas contacted regarding the requested disclosure.

4. The review should also concern itself with how, and why, both section 10 and 17 of the Act were breached. This should be measured in the light of undertakings given by both NYPCC's chief executive, and the PCC herself, in public, at a PCP meeting in November, 2017.




