#### ANPR – PAST to Present



- 2001 ANPR introduced
- 2013 Pilot NYP ANPR Hub
- 2015 Pilot success move to FCR
- 2016 Review of ANPR Hub
- 2017 Agreement to have dedicated ANPR staff
- 2018 ANPR Hub fully staffed and stand alone







The Road Crime Team's affiliation with the popular BBC One series **Traffic Cops** started back in 2010 when they were joined by cameramen to film two series of the spi off show **Motorway Cops** with the former Yorkshire & Humber Regional Roads Crime Team.

hat team went on to film a series of **Traffic Cops** which, for the first time in series' istory, featured head-worn cameras that caught all the action from the perspective of ne team members.

Following the officers' return to force they were rejoined by the Traffic Cops team who filmed two further series in 2014 and 2015, focussing solely on North Yorkshire Police and the work of its Road Crime and Roads Policing officers.

The first episode of these two series, Rural Raiders, aired in May 2015, with the remainder of episodes due on screen over the summer.



#### Intelligence and ANPR



#### Intelligence led policing utilising ANPR in NYP has helped:-

- Protect vulnerable children from the risk of sexual and criminal exploitation.
- Take drugs and criminal property of the streets.
- Put resources in the right place at the right time and make North Yorkshire a hostile environment for travelling criminals.

Which in turn supports local, regional and national strategic objectives.

## ANPR / Intelligence success

- October 2017. Intelligence received of a vehicle travelling through NYP suspected of being involved in the supply of drugs from Liverpool to the North East.
- Analysis indicated that the vehicle comes into NYP on Saturday mornings from M62 to A1M northbound
- 09:37hrs 14/10/18 Vehicle hits ANPR camera and caused to stop.
- A significant quantity of cocaine was recovered from the vehicle.
- Offender convicted and sentenced to 3 ½ yrs in prison.

#### Here's a snapshot ...

Two wanted Leeds men arrested after officers intercepted their car – one in connection with an aggravated burglary in Selby the week before & one wanted by West Yorkshire Police for assault.

Two men arrested on suspicion of supplying class A drugs in York. One of them also arrested on suspicion of burglary & fraud after officers intercepted their vehicle on a journey from Merseyside to North Yorkshire. Cocaine & heroin also seized.


Three York men arrested on suspicion of fuel theft after their vehicle was intercepted thanks to information from a vigilant passer by who reported suspicious activity.

Three men arrested in York following theft of phones from o2 shop in Selby. ANPR helped officers track their vehicle from Selby to the centre of York.

#### ANPR.....

- Assisted in 727 arrests in 2018 and;
- Helped safeguard 36 vulnerable people
- Provides evidence in criminal prosecutions
- Over 1000 storm logs tagged to ANPR / month
