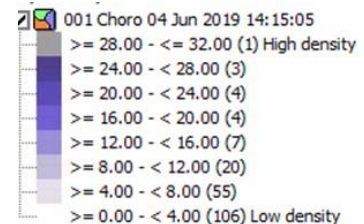
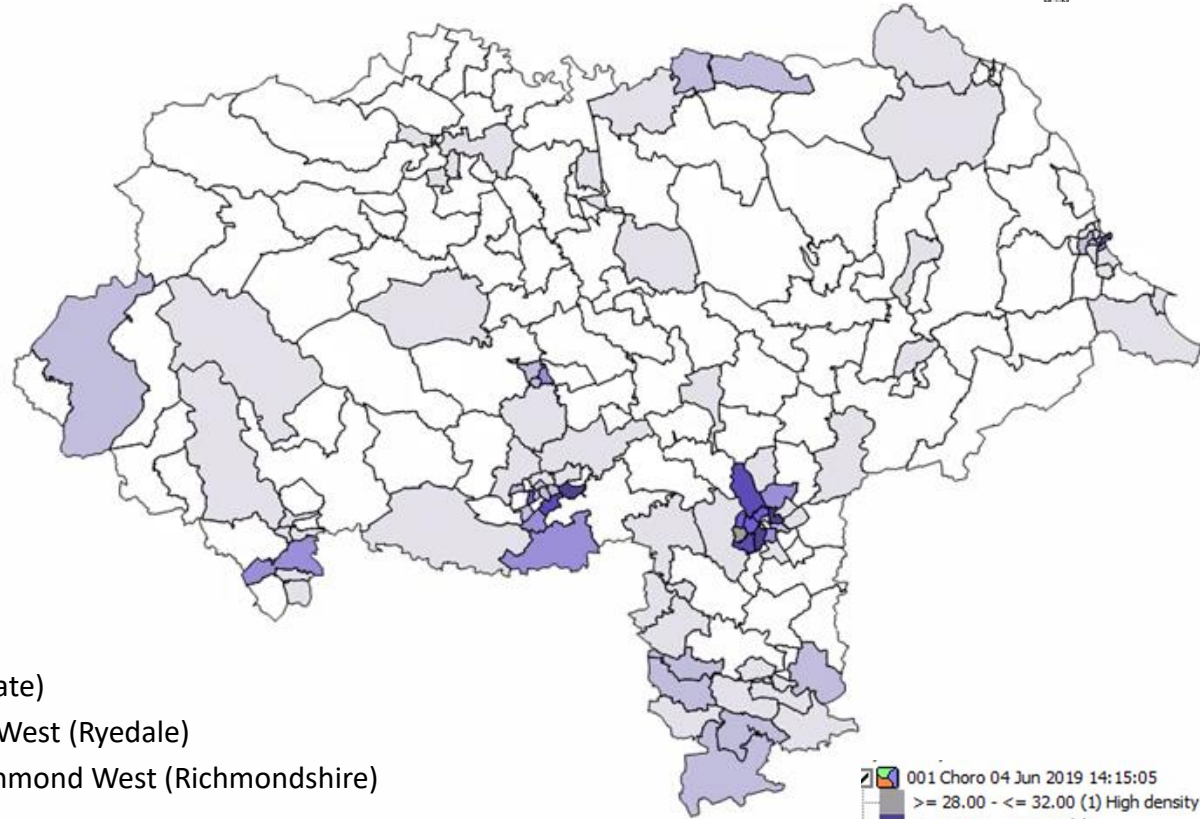

Offender Profile

Arrests:

- 94 – Scarborough & Ryedale
 - 84 – York
 - 57 - Harrogate
 - 34 - Hambleton & Richmondshire
 - 25 – Selby
 - 23 – Craven

- Offenders are predominantly male, peak ages 12 to 21yrs. UK citizenship.
 - Of those arrested for burglary, theft from shop, criminal damage and assault are the three peak offence types committed by the offenders

Impact:

- Scarborough & Ryedale are impacted by Scarborough offenders
 - York are impacted by York offenders
 - Harrogate, Craven and Selby are impacted predominantly by West Yorkshire (Bradford/Leeds) offenders
 - Hambleton & Richmondshire are impacted by H&R nominals with minimal impact from Northumbria offenders
-
- 41 repeat offenders – peak offender from Humberside who has impacted in York (11 offences)



Residential Burglaries - Headlines

Stolen Property

- Keys (60) most stolen property with 19 recorded as car keys
- Other machinery/tools (49) second most stolen category (power tools)
- Rings (43)
- Handbags (32)
- Three burglaries recorded where firearms have been stolen (not recovered) Gun cabinets have been entered with shotguns removed. No suspects or arrests. Unable to confirm if the premises or gun cabinets were specifically targeted.
