

Mental Health

Occurrences involving a person(s) with a mental health qualifier



- There are significant increases in occurrences with Mental Health tags in the last 5 months. This is in part due to increased tagging of these incidents, allowing for a better, more tailored approach in initial response.
- Incidents with a Mental Health tag have accounted for 12% of all incidents in the last 22 months



Use of police custody as a place of safety
Police custody must only be used for s136 MHA detainees in highly exceptional circumstances, e.g. genuinely unmanageable risks of resistance, aggression, violence or escape, or if also detained for an offence. We scrutinise every use of custody in these circumstances.


The below volumes have been reviewed and changed. Previously any \$136 detention that occurred in custody has been counted, however, all but the below incidents, custody was not actually used as a place of safety, the incident occurred whilst in custody before the individual was transferred to a recognised Health Based Place of Safety and as such custody was never used as a Place of Safety. In these cases, the mental ill-health of the detainee was identified after their arrival at a custody suite.



 - 2 No Ambulance available within 30mins


Gender/Age Breakdown and Repeat Nominals











Highest Wards by Crime Volume








Highest Wards by Crime Volume




Proactivity: How has proactive policing contributed to control strategies? (October 2019)

Split of 728 hours appointed to FSU








The actual number of Officers has decreased by 2.23 FTE from the previous month. The 5.63 FTE leavers are broken down to 4 retirements and 1.63 resignations. The number of starters is lower than projected (2 Direct Entry Inspectors will now start in November). The number of leavers is less than that projected.

The next intake of Student Officers is planned for November 2019. Student Officer intakes have been amended as part of Operation Uplift, with an additional intake in March 2020. The next intake of transferees is planned for January 2019, with further intakes throughout the year.







Current initiatives

- New interactive management information dashboard for better absence and well-being insights including trends, reason for sickness and comparisons to previous years developed by nexus team on behalf of HR.
