

- Ensure our decisions take account of the work of partners, in particular the police, to ensure a cohesive approach to Covid -19 recovery is achieved












Challenges – Tactical Approach

CHIMNEY FIRES - DON'T RISK IT!

Thank you to Charlie Morton for supplying a guest article this month on the important issue of chimney fires and how to avoid them.

7,000 fires in England are chimney related.

Get your chimneys cleaned twice a year.

DON'T RISK IT!

In England, there are an average of 7,000 chimney fires per year, many of which can be prevented with regular sweeping; chimneys with oil and gas fires should be swept once a year, coal - twice a year, wood - up to four times a year.

You should also make sure you have working smoke alarms in your home. These are ways that lower the chance of a chimney fire in your home and reduce the risks of damage, injury or even death if one occurs.


