Your police precept will be used to provide:

- 34 additional officers allocated to the customer contact centre to improve the service to the public.
- 13 additional officers to support neighbourhood policing teams across North Yorkshire and York.
- 9 additional officer and staff posts to raise standards and improve the quality of engagement with victims of violence against women and girls.
- 10 additional officers to strengthen and grow the roads policing team and support the strategy to reduce deaths and injuries on the area's roads.



North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service

When governance of the Service transferred to the Commissioner in 2018 we inherited a Financial Plan with a £2.6m imbalance across its 4 year life span. Since then, a significant amount of work has been undertaken and Financial Plans set out in February 2021 forecasted a balanced plan by 2023/24.

Unfortunately, due to unexpected pay awards, the higher costs of utilities, and costs linked to our ageing buildings, our costs are increasing faster than our funding.

I am working with the Chief Fire Officer to look at all options to be more effective and efficient to ensure that we best match our resources to our risk and build a stable and balanced financial plan.

I want to reassure everyone that no matter the challenges we face we will always ensure that the Service has what it needs to protect our communities.

Precept 2022/2023

Keeping you safe, and feeling safe

After hearing from more than 2,500 members of the public, I have set the precepts for our police and fire services.

In the survey, nearly two-thirds of residents supported an increase in the police precept of over 1.99 per cent with four in ten accepting an increase of £10 or more. For the fire and rescue precept, seven in ten supported an increase of up to £1.47.



I know these are difficult times for families and individuals across North Yorkshire and York so I have tried to balance the pressures on household finances with the need to continue to ensure we give North Yorkshire Police and North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue the resources to keep us safe and feeling safe.

The increase in the precept will allow us to deliver on having more police officers on our streets and support efforts to tackle violence against women and girls, but with other financial pressures increasing it means there will be a continued need to collaborate and develop further efficiencies while protecting communities.

I will continue to call on government for fairer funding for North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service. We face significant financial pressures but I will ensure we engage extensively so we make the right decisions, even though they may be difficult.
