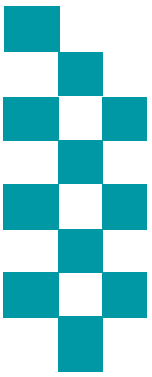

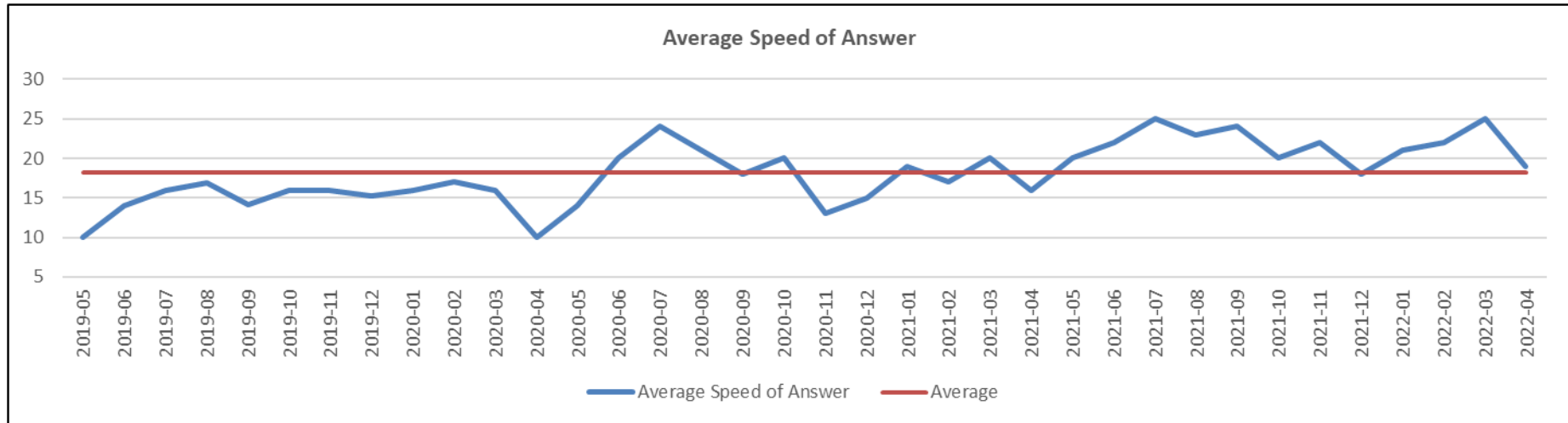

Average Speed of Answer trend (blue line) for the period 01st May 2019 – 30th April 2022.



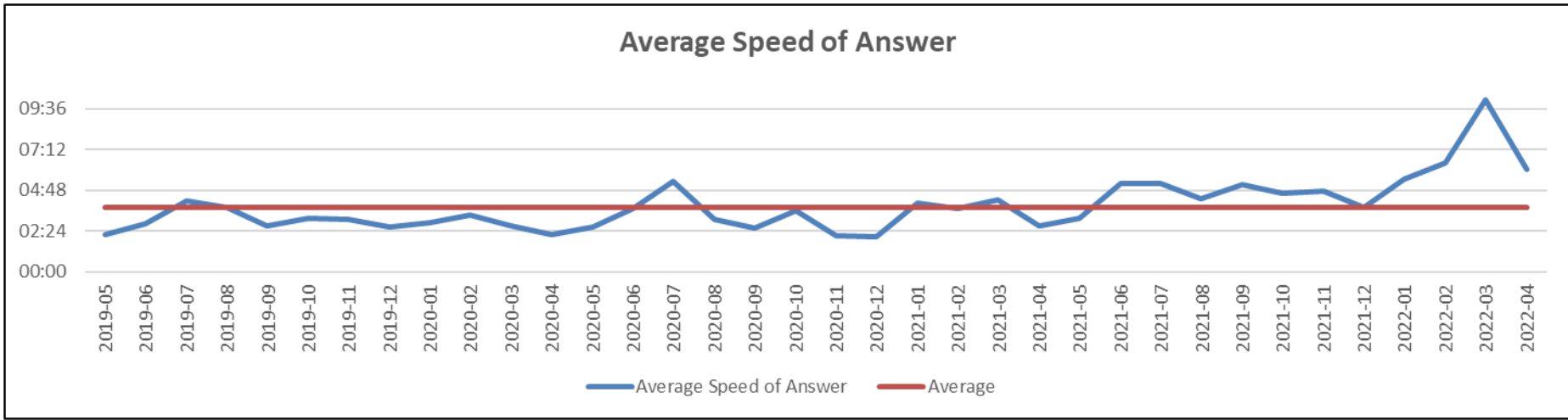

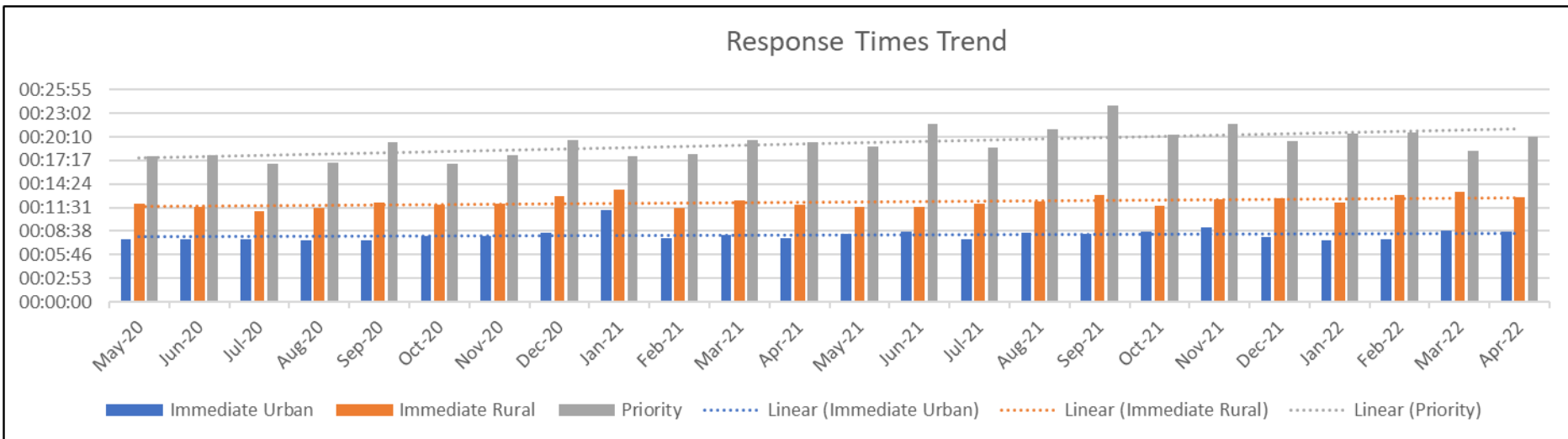
Average Speed of Answer trend (blue line) for the period 01st May 2019 – 30th April 2022.



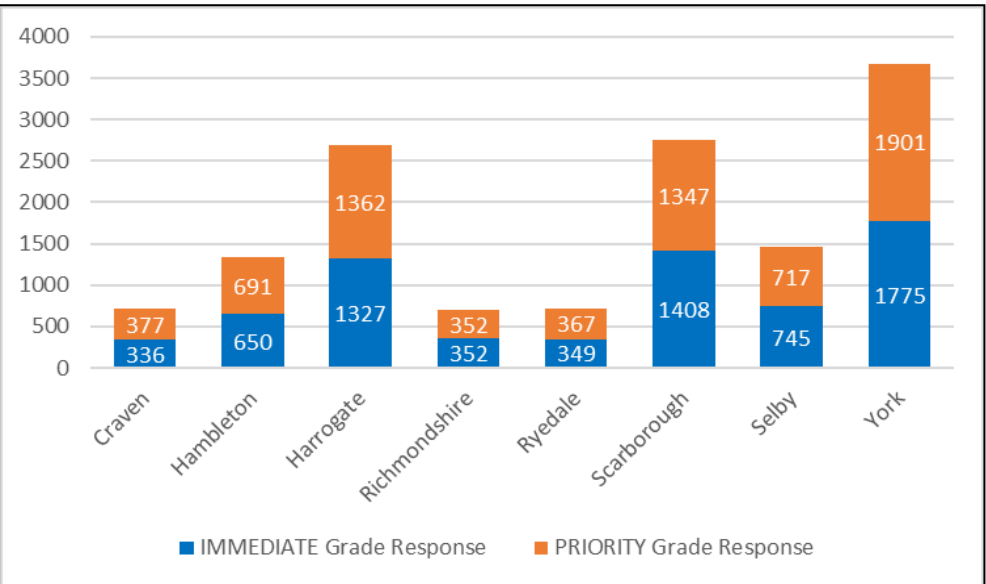

90 Day Data - Incident volumes by District (05/02/2022 – 05/05/2022)



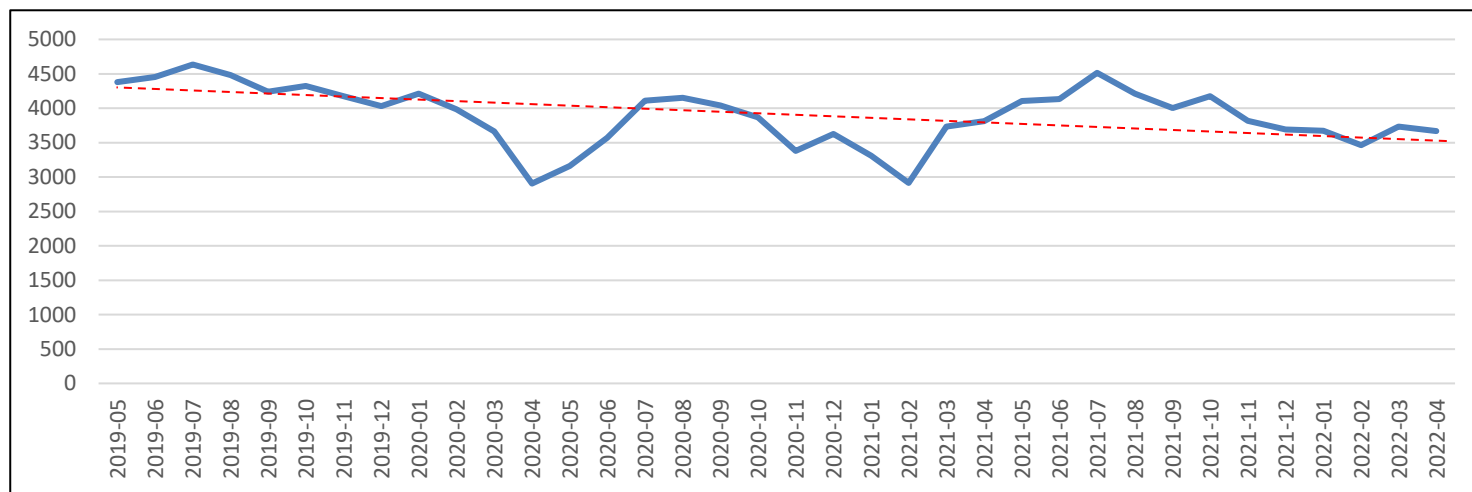

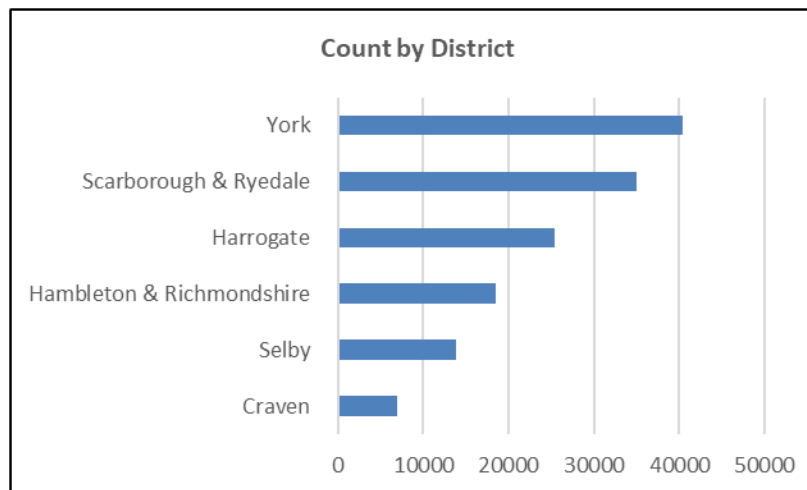


Crime Levels

3 Year Crime Trend (Period: 01st May 2019 – 30th April 2022)



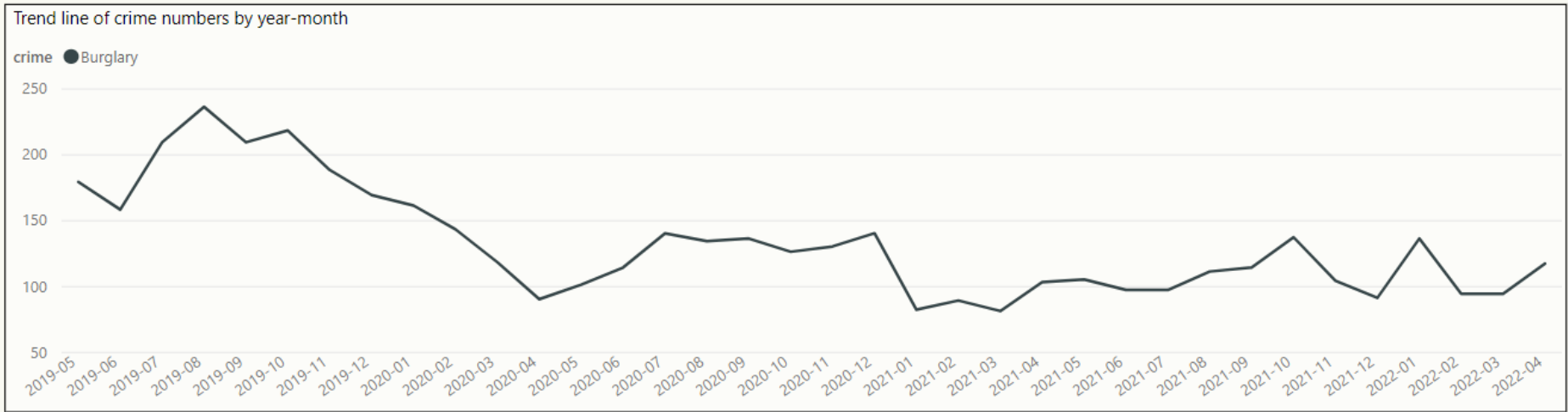

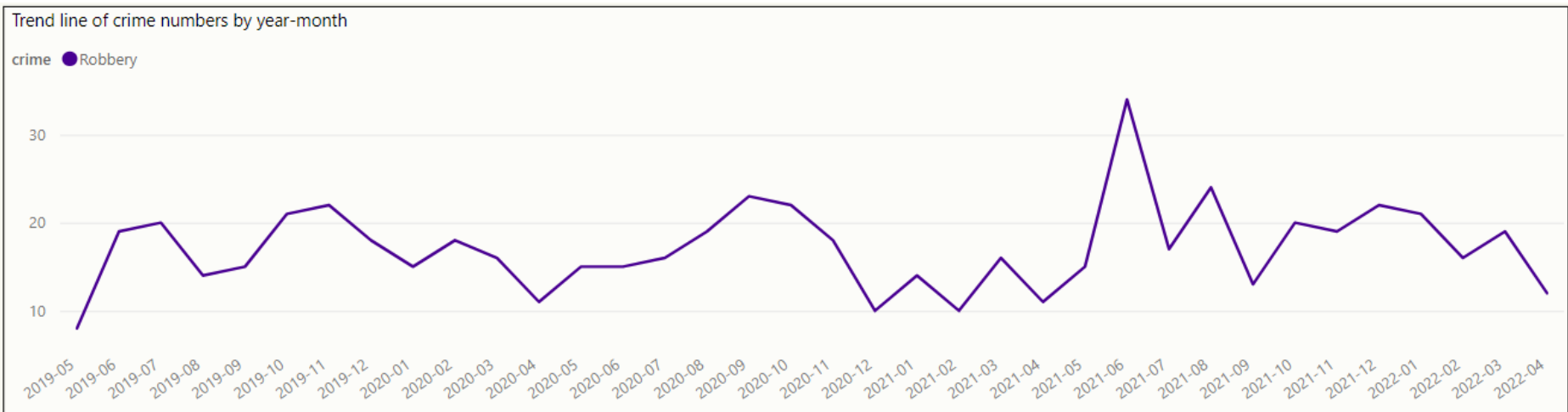

Burglary - Residential

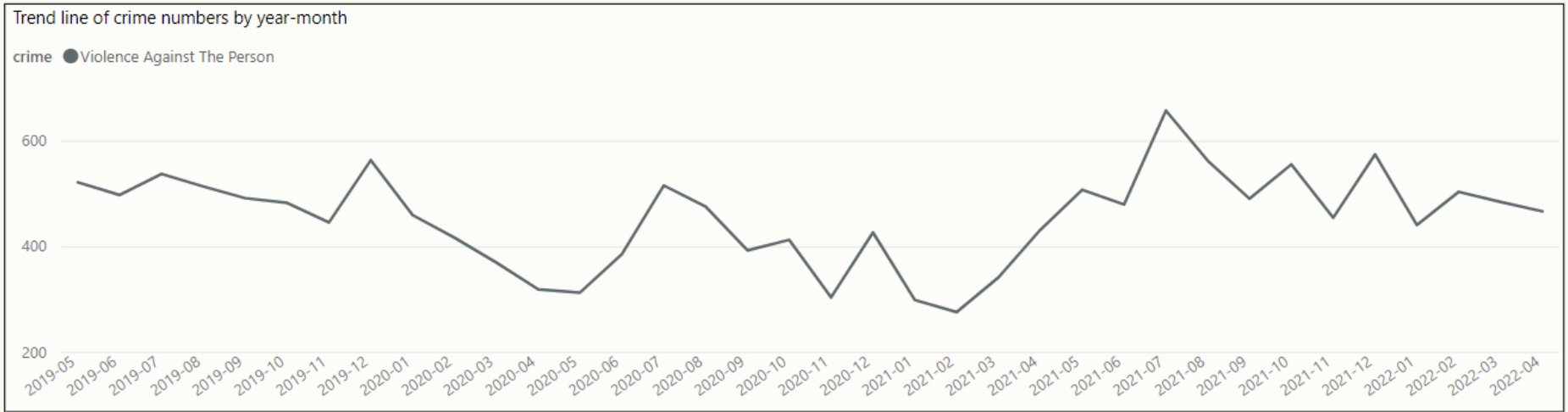

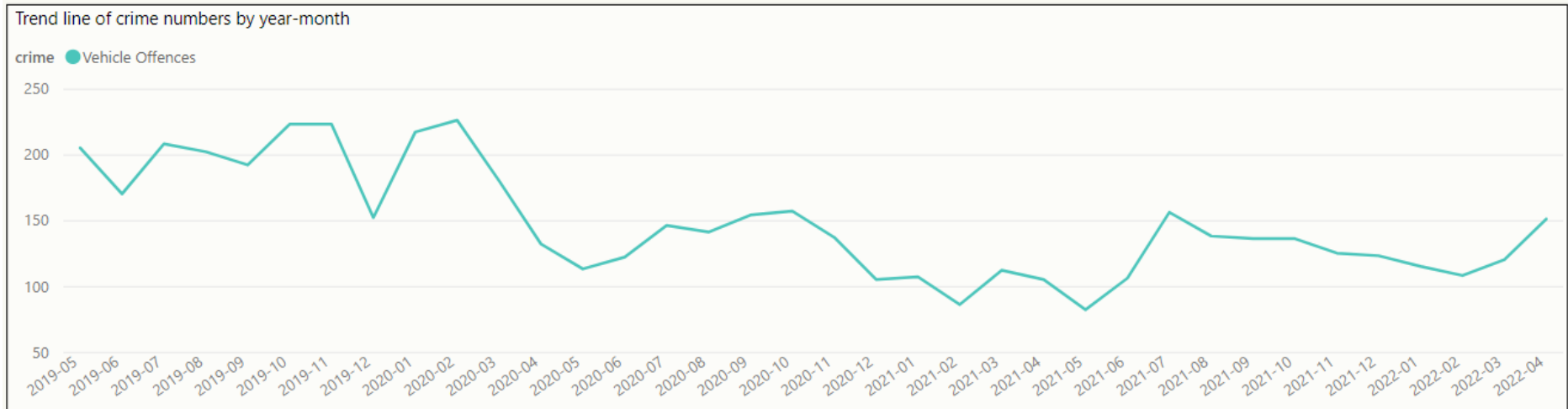

Crime investigative outcomes – All Crimes

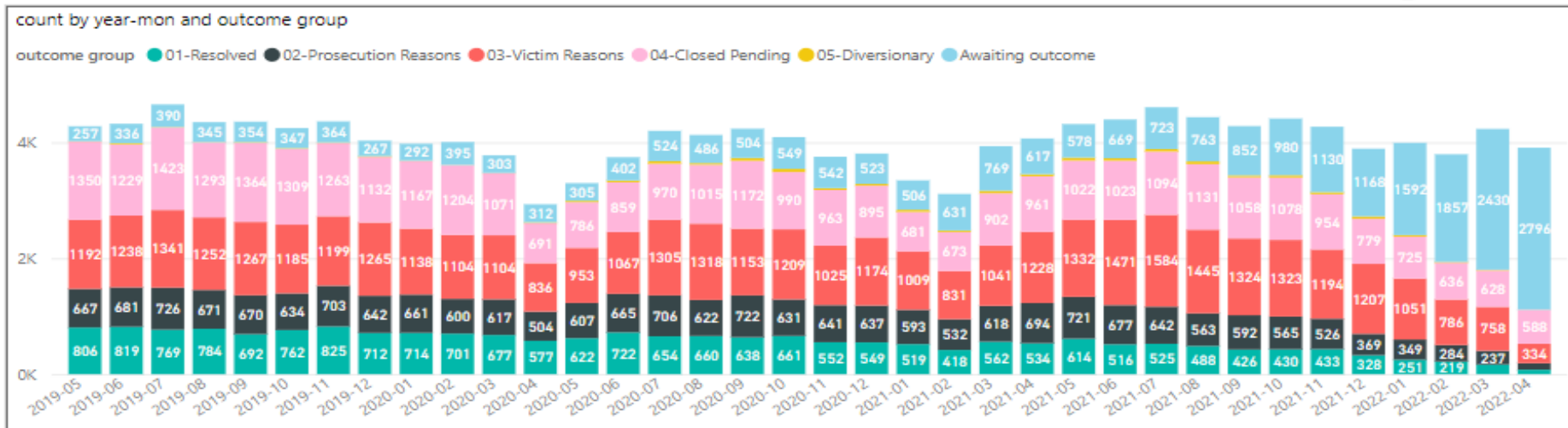

- Awaiting outcome (17.76%)

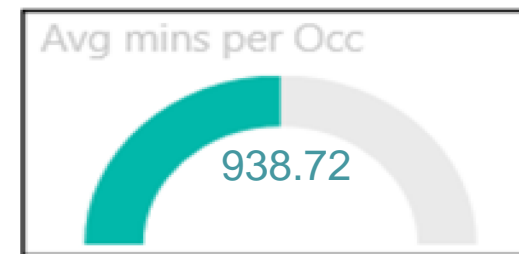
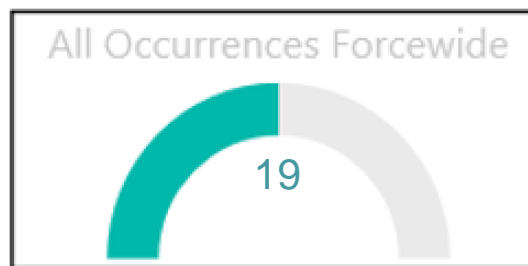
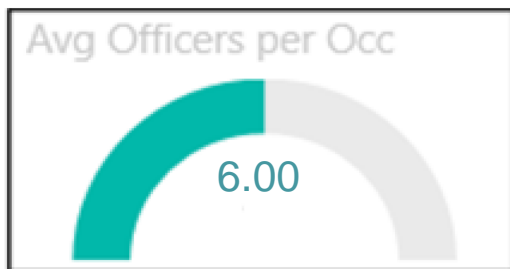

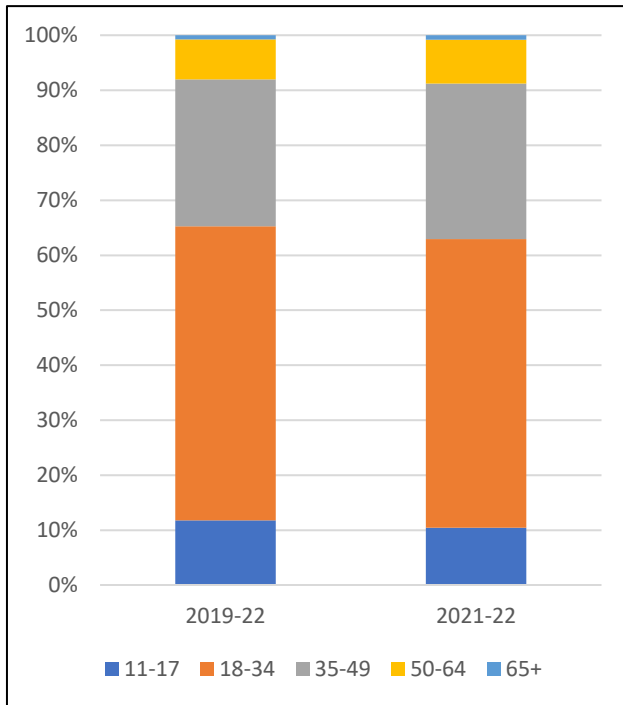
- April 2022 was slightly higher than the average incident levels previously seen.
- No detainees were required to be taken out of the county this month
- 6 incidents required Police transportation 1 following Risk assessment
- 12 incidents were transported by ambulance
- 36.84% of detentions resulted in Admission

Use of Force

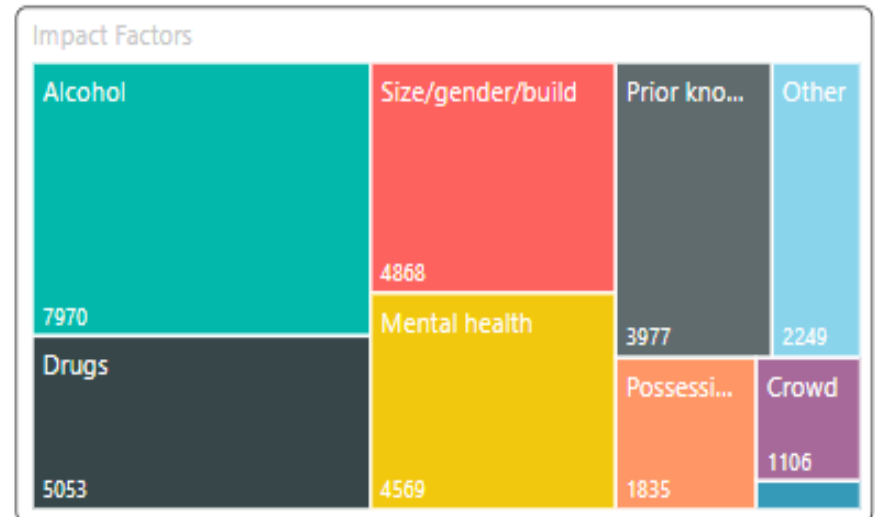
Date period: 01/05/2019 – 30/04/2022 - Throughout this period a total of 15782 'Use of Force' forms have been submitted



The age profile for the last 3 years and the last 12 months is almost identical. 18-34 year olds are most often the subject with a small decrease in the proportion of reports involving 11-17 year olds during the last year. In the last year 63.52% of contacts within the 11 – 17 year age group have comprised tactical communications.

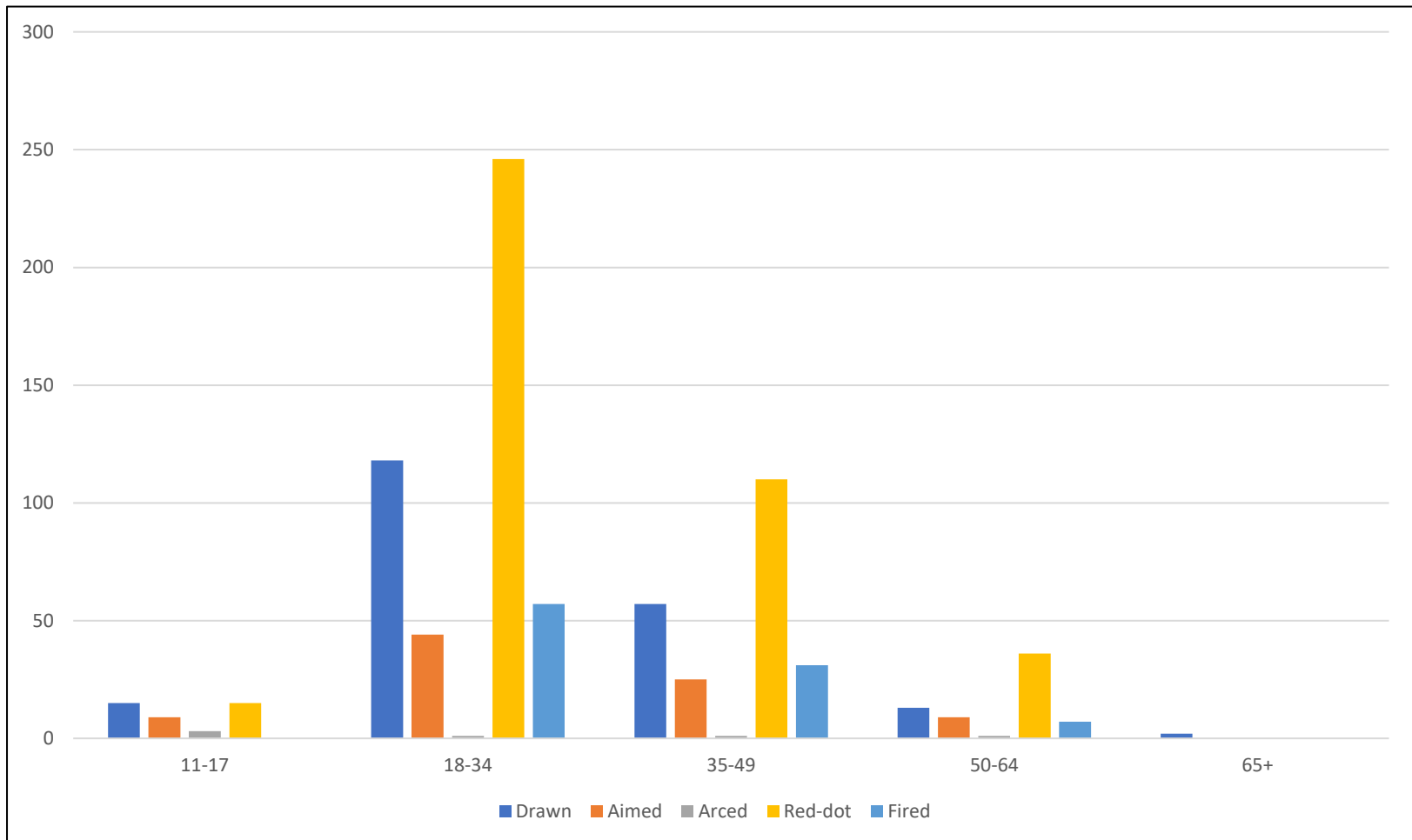


Alcohol (25.46%) and Drugs (16.218) are the most frequently recorded factors across all age groups.

The Police Staff figures decreased by 5.32 from the previous month, Special Constables decreased by 7 and volunteers have decreased by 14 against the previous month.

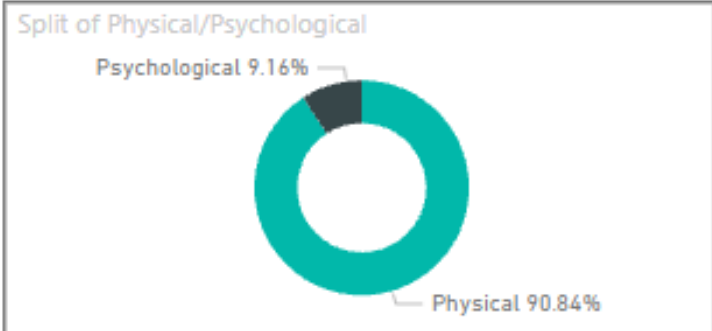

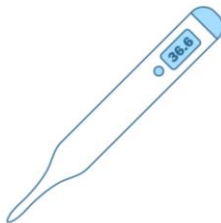
Sickness and Absence
