





#### 90 Day Data - Incident volumes by District (16/10/2022 - 12/01/2023)









Residential Burglary Resolved Outcome Rate: 1.83% Average investigation time: 50 Days \*31.86% Awaiting Outcome







- December 2022 was higher than the average incident levels previously seen.
- 0 detainees required to be taken out of the county this month
- 15 incidents required police transportation, 3 following a risk assessment, 11 ambulance not available within 30 minutes, 1 ambulance wasn't called, 3 not recorded.
- 9 incidents were transported by ambulance, 4 incident not recorded.
- 41.38% of detentions resulted in Admission



## Force legitimacy (Stop Search – Ethnicity)

Date Period: 01st January 2022 – 31st December 2022

North Yorkshire is a safe place to live and attracts numerous visitors that enjoy its iconic sights and beautiful landscapes. In addition it attracts those who wish to cause harm. This section looks at the differential between residents and non-resident stop and search information (please note that some stop searches do not contain residential status)

#### Residents (76.32% of the total where place of residence is recorded)



Black, Asian, Mixed ethnicities account for 3.24% of those searches where selfdefined ethnicity was recorded. White ethnicity accounts for 88.44%












Stop searches where a positive outcome resulted (arrest, caution, penalty notice, summons or warning) ranged from 15.33% (Mixed ethnicity) to 45.45% (Asian ethnicity).

#### Non-residents



Black, Asian, Mixed ethnicities account for 15.27% of those searches where selfdefined ethnicity was recorded. White ethnicity accounts for 69.24%











Stop searches where a positive outcome resulted (arrest, caution, penalty notice, summons or warning) ranged from 16.67% (Black ethnicity) to 30.77% (Mixed ethnicity), and. 22.05% (White ethnicity).

Overall whilst there appears disproportionate stop search numbers based on ethnicity this is mainly reflected in stop search of non-residents. The higher positive outcome rates for non-residents supports the view that this is intelligence led, focussed on those who come into North Yorkshire to cause harm.


No PCSOs left in December, for the first time this financial year, and one member of Police Staff transferred to become a PCSO.
