



# **Emergency Calls - 999**













# Our policing response




The national standards for response times are: Immediate Urban – 15mins / Immediate Rural – 20mins / Priority – 60mins.

### 90 Day Data - Incident volumes by District (08/02/2023 – 09/05/2023)


















Budget Target for FTE remains at 1645.00 in 23/24, but we are still also tracking headcount closely as a requirement for additional funding from the Home Office.

Headcount target is therefore 1665.

We are currently on track to achieve both targets, and will monitor attrition and the recruitment pipeline closely each month to ensure this positive situation remains.


Attrition was lower in April than previously projected, and both PCDA and transferee intakes in June are on track with planned numbers of incoming officers.




