## Notice Regarding Publication of Annual Financial Information for Policing, Fire and Crime Functions in North Yorkshire

Following the establishment of the York and North Yorkshire Combined Authority (YNYCA) and the transfer of Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner functions to the Mayor, financial reporting arrangements have changed.

From the financial year 2024/25 onwards, transactions relating to policing, fire and crime functions—previously reported separately by the Office of the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (OPFCC)—are now included within the Combined Authority's Statement of Accounts. This reflects the statutory consolidation of functions and financial responsibilities under the governance of the Mayor and the Combined Authority.

As a result, there will no longer be a standalone set of accounts for these services. Interested parties seeking financial information, including details of expenditure, governance, and audit arrangements for policing and fire services, should refer to the Combined Authority's accounts.
